



Featured Artist: Roxanne Ando

he MAA Gallery is featuring the delicate work of watercolorist Roxanne Ando during the June show. This gentle painter loves the world of nature as anyone who has seen her paintings knows. Although of Japanese heritage---both sets of grandparents immigrated to the U.S. in the early 1900s---Roxanne grew

up mostly in northern Virginia after travels typical of an "Army brat" family largely ceased. Her college education and law school took her to the Michigan, Russia and Boston, but she returned home, only to cross the border into DC and Maryland, where she has spent most of her adult life. Ando works part time in nonprofit management, pursuing another long-time passion: services for low-income elderly.

As with many members of MAA who didn't major in art in college, at a certain point in her professional and family

life, there was time and a desire for exploring extracurricular activities. For Roxanne that came about 12 years ago, when she began taking a class in Chinese water color taught by local Chinese artist, Helen Mc-

Carthy. The class turned out to be a good match, and she continued studying the bird/flower tradition of Asian brush painting until her teacher retired. Since then Roxanne has been studying Chinese landscape painting with Freda Lee McCann. Part of the motivation for Ando to take up Asian brush painting in particular was "to connect to her heritage." A recent trip to Japan has reinforced that bond. "I took lots of photos of misty mountains, temples and shrines. Hopefully, that inspiration will start to be reflected in my work."

Ando told me it took three years before she did paintings she actually liked, and for a while, selling her work was not even a consideration. However, a friend encouraged her to join an art association as a way of breaking into marketing. She finds this a less intimidating way to sell her work and a great way to meet many wonderful artists. 

For example, in order to better show off and highlight the artwork, we are limiting the number of artworks per entrant to 5 this year. Last year, the sheer volume of entries forced us to display some artwork in not the most optimal fashion. We have made adjustments to assure that every piece of art submitted gets a fair placement in the Armory.

We will also have the usual adult and children's "Paint the Town Plein Air Competition" on Saturday and, again, hold a special Invitational Award category competition. As you know, the Best in Show Bertha Clum Award, sponsored by the Town of Kensington, is selected from the Kensington category entries.

Speaking of that, I intend to pay an early visit to Kensington to scope out and create the required Kensington piece needed to enter the Labor Day "Paint the Town" show. We have begun our initial promotions for the show so don't wait until the last moment to figure out what you will be painting. It's NEVER too early! So make yours the best ever this year by capturing the spirit of life in Kensington.

Pulling off this show is an enormous task. Everyone who enters is required to volunteer to help. **Michael Shibley** is the Paint the Town show coordinator again this year. So when he asks for your extra help – please say "YES, of course, how can I help?"

I also want to call your attention to our Featured Artist for this month—Roxanne Ando. Her beautiful paintings will be featured in the MAA Gallery beginning Wednesday, June 1 and running through Sunday, June 26. You will have an opportunity to meet and talk with Roxanne at her reception on Sunday, lune 5 from 1:00 - 5:00 PM in the Gallery. You should come by an offer your support to your fellow artist as she puts her work front center at the Gallery. Hope to see you there.

2016 Art Kudos International Juried Online Competition

Art Kudos is an annual international juried competition that serves to recognize and honor excellence in the visual arts.

Artists who are selected as finalists benefit from world-wide exposure in a year-long online exhibition (www.artkudos.com) and

have the opportunity to win cash awards for their exemplary work. A total of \$4.500 will be awarded. The competition is open to all artists 18 or older. Eligible media include: acrylics, oils, watercolors, pastels, drawings, printmaking, photography, digital art, sculpture, installations, wood, glass, ceramics, fiber art, and mixed media. Media not accepted: video/film, wearable art (clothing or jewelry). Cash awards totaling \$4,500 will be distributed as follows: Best of Show, \$1,200; Second Place - \$1,000; Third Place - \$750; Founder's Award of

Distinction - \$500; (3) Merit Awards - \$250 each; (3) Honorable Mentions -\$100 each. The registration fee is \$35 for 3 images. The deadline for application is June 30, 2016. To apply, please visit http://www.artkudos. com/prospectus.html
